

Clinical Trials

What is a clinical trial?
A clinical trial is a research study involving people who volunteer to participate. Clinical trials evaluate whether a new drug, treatment, or combination of treatments is safe, effective, and possibly better than the current (standard) treatment. They may also evaluate a new method of preventing cancer, diagnosing cancer, managing side effects, or improving a patient's quality of life. Clinical trials may offer a patient treatment options not otherwise available, access to high-quality care, and the chance to help other patients with cancer. Almost all medical advances related to the prevention and treatment of cancer are a result of clinical trials.

What are the phases of a clinical trial?
Research is completed in three phases. Phase I aims to
