[CaringBridge](#) [10] ([iPhone](#) [11], [Android](#) [12], and [mobile website](#) [13]): Visit [CaringBridge](#) [14] pages to view and post updates by friends and family members with cancer. Free.

[Drug Trials](#) ([iPhone](#)) [15]: Use this application to search clinical trials information from the National Institutes of Health's database, [clinicaltrials.gov](#) [16]. Free. (Developed by [FDABLE LLC](#) [17])

[Find a Health Center](#) ([iPhone](#)) [18]: Type in your zip code to find care at a federally funded health center near you. Free. (Developed by [Health Resources and Services Administration](#) [19])

iCANCer (iPhone) [20]: iCANCer is an app designed to help patients, caregivers, and cancer survivors manage their medical information. Developed by a two-time cancer survivor, iCANCer seeks to help personalize your cancer journey and store all your important medical information including cancer treatments, medications, medical issues, appointment information, and medical contacts. LIVESTRONG English-Spanish Dictionary of Cancer Terms (iPhone) [22]: Search more than 6,000 English and Spanish cancer-related terms. Definitions provided by the National Cancer Institute. Free. (Developed by Springbox, Ltd.)

Pocket Cancer Care App (iPhone) [23]: Browse questions to ask your doctor based on your diagnosis, build a list of questions, and record and play back your doctor's answers. Free. (Developed by the National Coalition for Cancer Survivorship [24])

MyQuit Coach (iPhone) [25]: Design a personalized plan to quit smoking and get inspirational photos, motivational tips, progress charts, and achievement badges as you progress. Free. (Developed by Demand Media, Inc. for **LIVESTRONG**)

My QuitLine(iPhone) [26]: Connect with a trained quit smoking counselor at the National Cancer Institute Quitline by phone or online chat. Free. (Developed by teatime media)

QuitGuide (iPhone) [27]: This interactive guide helps you prepare to quit smoking and find support after you quit. Free. (Developed by MMG, Inc. for smokefree.gov)

SmokefreeTXT [28] (smartphone not required): This mobile service designed for teens provides text messages with encouragement, advice, and tips to quit smoking. Free, but text message rates apply. (Developed by the National Cancer Institute [29])
