The <u>Conquer Cancer Patient Advocate Scholarship Program</u> provides an opportunity for patient advocates to attend the <u>ASCO Annual Meeting</u> in person and then return to their organizations and communities to share what they have learned. The goal of the program is to motivate scholarship recipients to participate in consumer advocacy opportunities, lending a crucial perspective and making a difference in the lives of people affected by cancer.

Scholarship Information

The 2024 ASCO Annual Meeting will be held at McCormick Place Convention Center in Chicago, from May 31– June 4 and will offer presentations on the latest research in cancer care. This year's <u>program</u> will feature sessions complementing Dr. Lynn M. Schuchter's Presidential theme, *The Art and Science of Cancer Care: From Comfort to Cure.*

Applications will be accepted online only, from Monday, March 11 at 12:00 PM Eastern Time until 5:00 PM Eastern Time on Monday, March 18. Once the application period opens, a link to the fillable online application will be posted on the <u>Patient Advocate Programs at the ASCO Annual Meeting</u> and <u>Conquer</u> <u>Cancer Patient Advocate Scholarship Program</u> pages of <u>Cancer.Net</u>, ASCO's patient information website. You can also access the application from this page using the *apply now* button below. Please note, this link will not be accessible until the application period has opened.

All applicants will be notified of their application status by 5:00 PM Eastern Time on Friday, March 29. Submitting this application does not confirm that you will be awarded a scholarship. The selection process is competitive, as there are a limited number of scholarships available. Scholarships are intended for expenses related to air or train travel, lodging, and meeting registration for advocates traveling from outside the Chicago area to attend the meeting. Applications will be evaluated and reviewed based on the <u>Scholarship Eligibility and Criteria</u>. As a reminder, patient advocates who choose to participate in the meeting online-only, rather than in person, may register at no charge. Scholarship Award Amounts and Payment Information

Please note that our payment practices at ASCO and Conquer Cancer have recently changed:

- Scholarship recipients based in the United States will receive \$2,000 via PayPal® or Zelle (no exceptions).
 Recipients will indicate their payment preference online and upload an IRS W-9 form before the ASCO Annual Meeting so payment may be remitted once the Meeting begins.
- Scholarship recipients based outside of the Continental United States (including Canada) will receive \$2,500 via PayPal[®], Zelle, or wire transfer (no exceptions). Recipients will indicate their payment preference online before the ASCO Annual Meeting so payment may be remitted once the Meeting begins.

Scholarship Eligibility and Criteria

Please read before completing a scholarship application.

- Scholarships are reserved for patient advocates only. This program is not intended for medical professionals, including nurses, physicians, physician assistants, social workers, patient navigators, or counselors.
- Eligibility is based primarily on financial need as well as advocacy background, experience, and current activities. Applicants will need to demonstrate a financial need as to why they would not be able to attend the ASCO Annual Meeting without a scholarship award.
- Eligibility is based on applicant's anticipated role and function at the ASCO Annual Meeting. Although scholarships are open to advocates affiliated with organizations that are registered exhibitors at the meeting, advocates who plan to attend the meeting to primarily staff an exhibit booth on behalf of a national not-for-profit organization (rather than attend the meeting sessions) are asked to refrain from applying for a scholarship.
- Consumer advocates who are involved in cancer advocacy for various organizations but are not compensated for their attendance at medical conferences are encouraged to apply. Priority will be given to patient advocates who indicate that they work as a *volunteer* on behalf of a non-profit organization that provides programs, services, information, resources, and/or support for people affected by cancer (rather than directly employed by a non-profit organization).

- Recipients should use the scholarship to attend the 2024 ASCO Annual Meeting, in person, which begins on Friday, May 31, at 1:00 PM Central Time and concludes on Tuesday, June 4, at 12:45 PM Central Time. Recipients may leave on Monday, June 3, if necessary.
- Priority will be given to advocates based outside of the Continental United States provided they meet the eligibility and criteria as outlined.
- Advocates awarded a scholarship must register for the ASCO Annual Meeting under the Patient Advocate registration category rate of \$190 by the early registration deadline of April 24, 2024, at 11:59 PM Eastern Time.
- A limited number of hotel rooms have been set aside for scholarship recipients at three area hotels, all within three miles of McCormick Place and on the ASCO shuttle route. Hotel reservations made through this block must be made online by April 17. Cancellation of travel and hotel reservations is not the responsibility of ASCO or Conquer Cancer.
- Scholarships are limited to up to 2 employees per organization (there is no limit for those who *volunteer* on behalf of a non-profit organization, academic institution, or serve as a patient advocate on a cancer research committee/panel/program).
- Scholarships are **non-transferable**; they may not be transferred from one awardee to another patient advocate.
- Advocates who plan to attend the meeting to primarily interview and film medical experts are asked to refrain from applying. If a scholarship recipient engages in such activity, the individual's scholarship will be revoked, and they will not be eligible to receive a scholarship in the future.
- U.S. based scholarship recipients should note that any unused portion of the scholarship (in excess of \$600) is subject to federal income tax.
